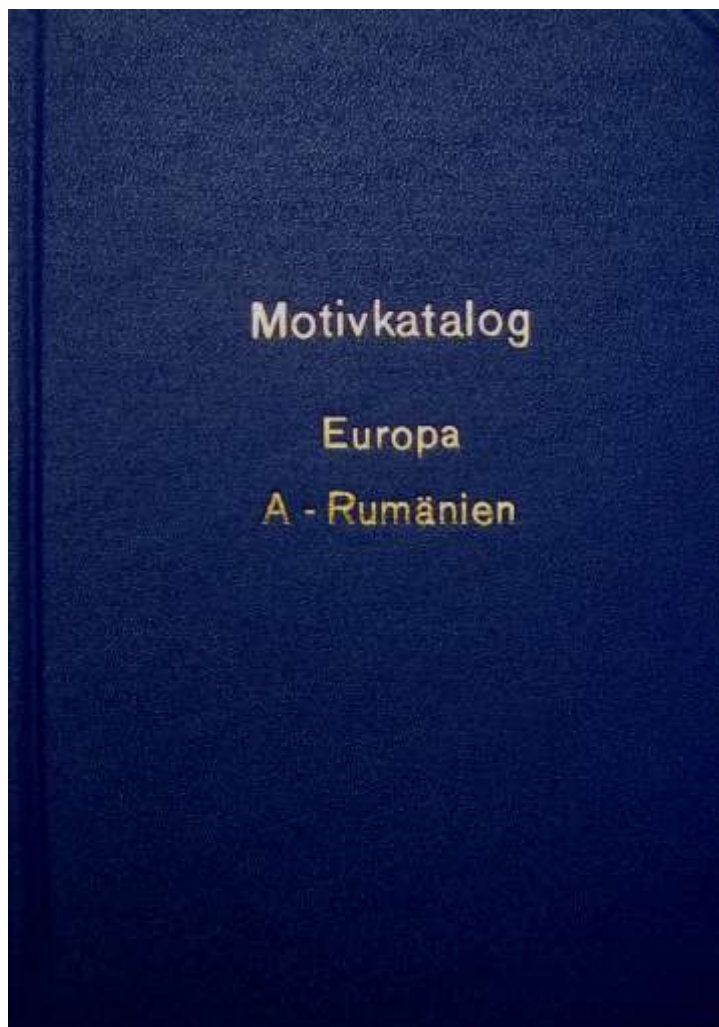

All catalogs are published in a handy DIN A5 format, bound, hardcover. The catalog is tailored to the needs of philatelists who collect, purchase or organize as an exhibit in the subject area of space or astronomy themes. All aerospace stamps, blocks, sheetlets and booklets issued by the time of publication of these catalogs are listed with the numbers from the Michel catalogs and illustrated in color. The comprehensive descriptions will have, as far as discoverable, an exact designation of the depicted spacecraft and missions undertaken. The background text and additional information is valuable especially for the exhibit designers. A laborious search for data and information in other literature sources is spared. Even for judges, this catalog provides a wealth of information which may facilitate an assessment of aerospace exhibits. Misstatements on the stamps are pointed out, known forgeries are explained in detail and illustrated. Overprints on stamps, printing errors and accidents in printing are displayed enlarged.
